Dear IBF Member Associations,

IBF's 'Presentation of the Game' Working Group is currently experimenting with various aspects of the sport to enhance its presentation and appeal. Part of this review includes experimentation with the scoring system.

In order that we might hear the views of all Members in this experimentation period, I would like to invite all IBF Member Associations to experiment with the following suggested scoring systems.

- 1. Rally point scoring to 25 points, best of 3 games. At 24, two clear points are needed. If the game goes to 30-all then first to 31. Winner of the previous point serves.
- 2. Rally point scoring to 25 points, best of 3 games. At 24, two clear points are need. If the game goes to 30-all then first to 31. Serving alternates every five points.
- 3. Service scoring to 11 points, best of 3 games. Setting to 13 at 10-all.

We are interested to hear your options on these suggested systems. We would encourage any experimentation that you are able to conduct in your own territories, and suggest that you may like to experiment with these scoring systems in you own local tournaments. We would welcome any findings that you might achieve as soon as possible.

Presentation of the Game - Experimentation Period

Dear Members,

After much discussion with the relevant people we have now narrowed our experiment on "Presentation of the Game" to the following:

- a) Piay to 21 points a game using rally point system (similar to table tennis and volleyball where a point is scored when any one of the players makes a mistake)
- b) At 20-all, the winner is the one who gets 2 points consecutively. To ensure that the game does not drag on too long, once they are 29-all, the player who scores the next point will be the winner
- c) For doubles, there will be only one service.
- d) the back inside line is to be removed. this means the doubles player can now serve high just as singles players do.

The Chair of Events, Mr Paisan Rangsikitpho, will send you more details about these changes soon.

Please experiment on the above and let us have your views. We intend to finalise the changes to be made during the IBF Council meeting in KL in early December 2005.
